FOOD ASSISTANCE

Reno Nevada, Washoe County, and surrounding communities such as Sparks, are served by many free food pantries. They may be able to distribute groceries, free food, produce, and even serve meals to the low income and needy. Both emergency assistance and long term support is arranged. Some of the food banks also have soup kitchens on site.

Residents also can contact the Salvation Army, community action agency, or even their local church to access free food or meals. There are other places to turn to for assistance in Washoe County. Individuals of the lowest income and who meet poverty criteria may be able to apply for government programs such as food stamps or general assistance.

Please call ahead before visiting any of these sites seeking assistance. Hours/services vary. Many require photo ID, proof of address, and completion of an intake form or other special requirements.
